



Did you know that in addition to watering a golf course, cemetery, and large landscapes around Novato, recycled water is available **FREE** to Novato area residents? Its true! There are only a few simple requirements, including a brief training and being able to transport it in your own containers that are between 5 and 300 gallons. For more information: contact North Marin Water District at (415) 897-4133, or visit www.nmwd.com and click on the "Residential Recycled Water Fill Station" links.

The recycled water is available through a partnership with North Marin Water District that provides over 150 million gallons of recycled water annually to help drought-proof our community. The program was originally built through our participation in a regional program involving wastewater recycling in Marin, Napa, and Sonoma Counties.

90 YEARS PROTECTING NOVATO'S HEALTH AND ENVIRONMENT


Voters approved forming the District in 1925 to protect public health and prevent epidemics through good sanitation. Today we continue to protect public health and the environment. We also create worth from Novato's waste through recycling and reuse programs.

YESTERDAY:

1925 VOTE TO PROVIDE SEWER AND GARBAGE SERVICE

Novato Advance, September 1925

Next Wednesday, a very important election will be held affecting every resident of Novato... Vote for the sanitary district and let us be prepared to combat any epidemic that might possibly invade our community.



Local citizens voted in 1925 to form the District as an independent agency with five elected directors.

While the initial service was garbage collection, by 1949 the first sewers and treatment plant were built for collection, treatment and disposal.

MORE IMPORTANT THAN DNA...?

In a poll of scientists by the British Medical Journal, public sanitation ranked higher than all other public health advances, including development of antibiotics, identification of DNA and anesthesia.

TODAY:

PROTECTING THE TOTAL ENVIRONMENT

WATER—RECYCLING FOR PEOPLE AND THE ENVIRONMENT

In summer, we recycle most of our treated wastewater by supplying it to over 800 acres of pasturelands and wildlife ponds. A smaller portion undergoes a higher level of treatment for use on a cemetery, parks, golf course and other large landscapes.



Recycled Water for Large Landscapes

LAND—COMPOSTING SOLIDS

The solids remaining from the treatment process are naturally composted.

FISH AND WILDLIFE—PROTECTION

Our household hazardous waste collection program keeps toxic chemicals out of the wastewater and the Bay.



Pasturelands

Our commercial and industrial pre-treatment program requires businesses to keep toxic substances out of the wastewater.

We use ultraviolet light disinfection instead of potentially toxic chlorine at our treatment facilities.

AIR—PROTECTING THE AIR AND GENERATING POWER

New facilities will allow the capture and recycling of gases from wastewater treatment to generate locally sourced, renewable, power and heat.
